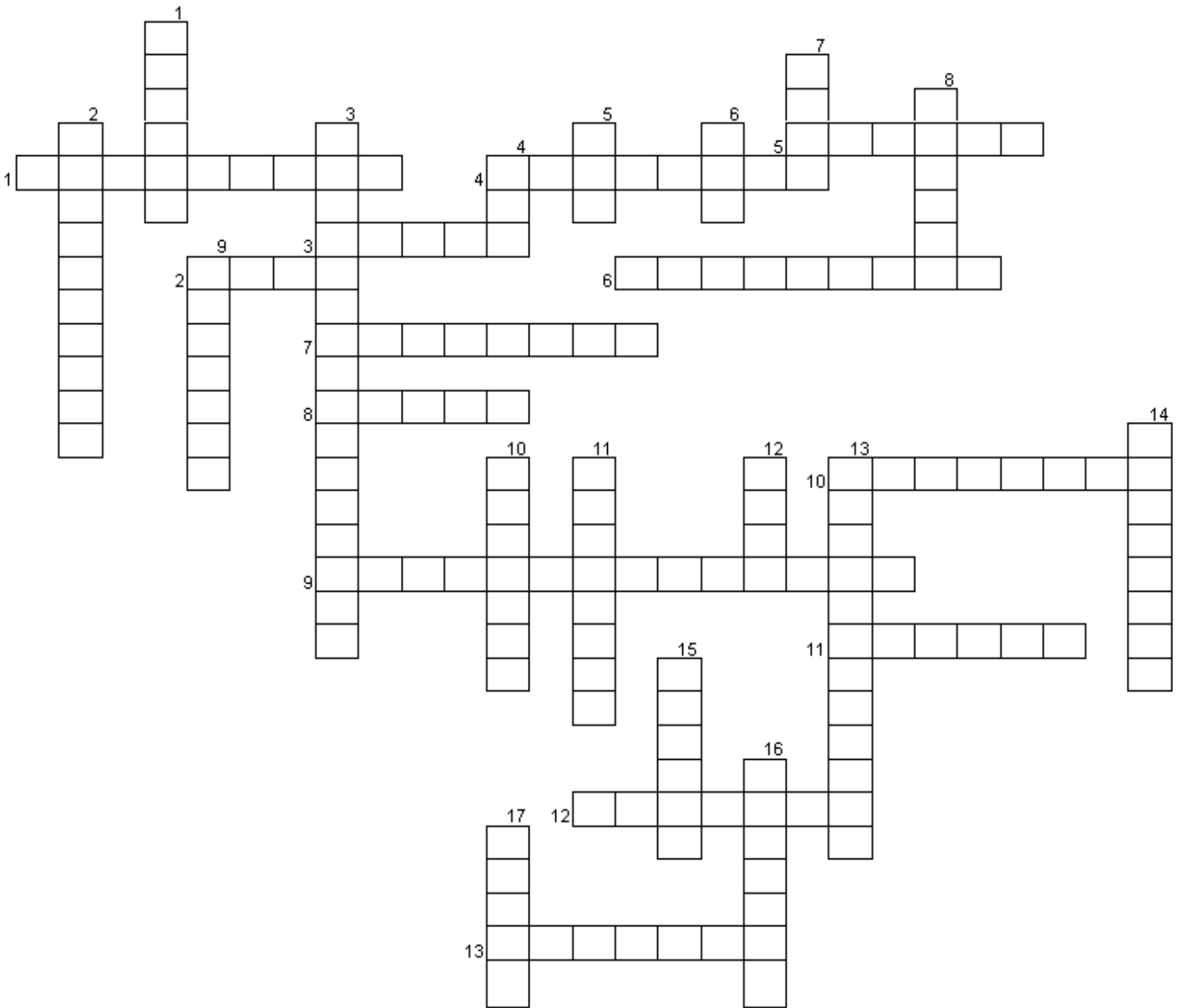


# Technology Cross Word Puzzle



Across:

1. The electronic transmission of voice, fax, or other data between individuals using systems associated with the telephone. (ex. Calling a friend)
2. Electronic information (ex. A computer file)
3. The basic protocol of the Internet (ex. How computers talk to one another.)
4. A way of protecting private networks from users from other networks (ex. Keeps hackers out of your computer)
5. Electronic holding place for instructions. (ex. It remembers what your computer has done since you have turned on the computer.)
6. A link on a Web pages that sends you to another Web page or resource. (ex. What you click on to go to another web-site.)
7. The moving of files from one computer to another (ex. Saving a file from your computer to a floppy disk.)
8. The exchange of messages by computers (ex. Sending an electronic letter.)
9. Physical hardware used to interconnect computers and users. (ex. All the computers on a network)
10. Programs used to operate computers and related devices. (ex. Windows 98)
11. The part of an e-mail message that describes the originator, the addressee and other recipients. (ex. A part of the e-mail that you do not see, but tells other computers who you are and where you are located.)
12. A system using logical means to search the Internet. (ex. A way of telling a computer to look for certain words on web pages.)
13. Captures images or text for computer editing and display (ex. Copying pictures from photographs to be used on a computer.)

Down:

1. A program that reads Web pages in order to create entries for a search engine index. (ex. Google.com)
2. Etiquette on the Internet (ex. How to behave on the Internet - no spamming.)
3. Exchanging messages instantaneously on the Internet with people who are online at the same time. (ex. Talking to friends using AIM.)
4. The simplest way to exchange files between computers on the Internet. (ex. Downloading or uploading files from one computer to another but not using a browser.)
5. The address of a file on the Internet (ex. Web address)
6. A language element descriptor (ex. It tells what the web page will be about.)
7. The set of markup symbols or codes that tells an Internet browsers how to display the page's words and images. (ex. The computer language used to make web pages.)
8. A set of network addresses (ex. An IP address)
9. Electronic technology that generates, stores, and processes data in terms of two states: positive and non-positive (ex. Used in fiber optic transmissions)
10. The network that became the basis for the Internet. (ex. The first network created by the military to keep information safe from nuclear attack.)
11. The special set of rules used when computers communicate. (ex. FTP or TCP/IP)
12. Any computer that has full two-way accesses to other computers on the Internet. (ex. A computer used as a server.)
13. A program that creates a huge index from the pages that have been read. (ex. Yahoo)
14. Primary text input device (ex. Has the alphabet on it and is used to type information into the computer)
15. Electronic transmission accomplished by alternating electromagnetic current (ex. Your household's phone)
16. A series of points interconnected by communication paths. (ex. All the schools' computers linked together)
17. A small device that is pushed across a desk surface to point to a place on a display screen and is used to select one or more actions. (ex. What you use to click on links or programs' icons on the computer)
