Sponsors **MUST** be registered and active in a parish; married in the Catholic Church; and be baptized and confirmed in the Catholic Church. Class instruction is on the **1ST SATURDAY** of every month - 1:00 p.m. in the parish hall. Baptisms take place on the **3RD SUNDAY** of every month.

DID YOU KNOW? FROM THE CATHOLIC CATECHISM

FOR ADULTS: The canon of the Bible, which is a term that refers to the books the Bible contains, was fixed within the first centuries of the Church. These books that make up both the Old and New Testaments were identified by the Church as having been divinely inspired. At times, people challenged the divinely inspired character of some of the books in the Bible. In 1546, the Council of Trent declared that all the books in both the Old and New Testament were inspired in their entirety. This declaration was subsequently confirmed by both the First Vatican Council (1869-1870) and the Second Vatican Council (1962-1965). Those books whose divinely inspired character was challenged appear in non-Catholic Bibles identified as either the "Deuterocanonical Books" or the "Apocrypha."
