BAPTISMS

Parents must arrange the Baptism of their child in advance in the parish office, and all necessary paperwork must be completed by the 1st week of the month. By diocesan regulation, parents must be **REGISTERED FOR THREE MONTHS** and together with the sponsors must attend **ONE** instruction in preparation for Baptism. Sponsors **MUST** be registered and active in a parish; married in the Catholic Church; and be baptized and confirmed in the Catholic Church. Class instruction is on the **1ST SATURDAY** of every month - 1:00 p.m. in the parish hall. Baptisms take place on the **3RD SUNDAY** of every month.

DID YOU KNOW? FROM THE CATHOLIC CATECHISM FOR

ADULTS: What does the name *Jesus* mean? Jesus means in Hebrew: "God saves."...Since God alone can forgive sins, it is God who, in Jesus His eternal Son made man, "will save His people from their sins." (CCC, no. 430, citing Mt. 1:21). Why is Jesus called *Christ*? The word "Christ" [*Christos*] comes from the Greek translation of the Hebrew *Messiah*, which means "anointed." It became the name proper to Jesus...because He accomplished perfectly the divine mission that "Christ" signifies. (CCC, no. 436)
