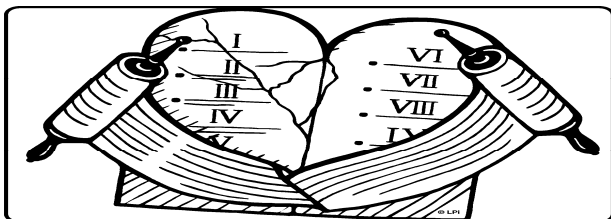
### CONFESSIONS - SATURDAY FROM 4:00 - 5:00 P.M. OR BY APPOINTMENT
