ARCHDIOCESAN 2ND COLLECTION - FOR CATHOLIC RELIEF

DID YOU KNOW? FROM THE CATHOLIC CATECHISM FOR

ADULTS: The Church and the Eucharist: The Church draws her life from the Eucharist. This truth does not simply express a daily experience of faith, but recapitulates the heart of the mystery of the Church. In a variety of ways, she joyfully experiences the constant fulfillment of the promise, "Lo, I am with you always, to the close of the age" (Mt 28:20), but in the Holy Eucharist, through the changing of the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of the Lord, she rejoices in this presence with unique intensity. Ever since Pentecost, when the Church, the People of the New Covenant, began her pilgrim journey towards her heavenly homeland, the Divine Sacrament has continued to mark the passing of her days, filling them with confident hope.

Our pastor called this day Laetare Sunday? Why? The term laetare comes from the first Latin word of the entrance song for the Fourth Sunday of Lent, Laetare Jerusalem (Rejoice Jerusalem). Laetare Sunday is mid-Lent, reminding us that Lent is half over, and that the rigors and discipline of the season will soon end in the fulfillment of Easter joy. Flowers and instrumental music are officially permitted on this Sunday, in contrast to the other Sundays of Lent.

Historically, Laetare Sunday is a remnant of the time in early church practice when the Lenten season was only three weeks long. This was the last Sunday before the Lenten fast and disciplines were to begin. It was celebrated with music, flowers, food and joy.
